


Psalm 23:1-6 (Jerusalem Bible)


- ¹ Yahweh is my shepherd, I lack nothing.

- He guides me by paths of virtue for the sake of his name.




- ⁴ Though I pass through a gloomy Valley, beside me your rod and your staff are there, to hearten me.
- ⁵ You prepare a table before me under the eyes of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil, my cup brims over.
















Preliminary Comments

The Two Main Metaphors in Psalm 23:

God as David's Shepherd (vv. 1-4)
God as David's Gracious Host (vv. 5-6)

God is the ultimate Shepherd-King to his people. People are the sheep of God's flock and the guests of God's kingdom.
























Rest in the PROVISIONS of the Lord. (1-3)

- God gives his people rest and refreshment. (2b-3a)
























REFLECTION

Lord, help me combat worry by trusting you to take care of me and those I love. (1)


Lord, help me combat hurry by taking time to enjoy a regular Sabbath rest. (2a)

Lord, help me combat stress by finding time to spend in the beauty of creation. (2b-3a)


Lord, help me combat the pressure of choice by regularly asking you for wisdom. (3b)
