The Old Testament Lesson: Zechariah 9:9-11

⁹ Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem!

See, your king comes to you, righteous and victorious,

lowly and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.

¹⁰ I will take away the chariots from Ephraim and the warhorses from Jerusalem, and the battle bow will be broken.

His rule will extend from sea to sea and from the River to the ends of the earth.

¹¹As for you, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will free your prisoners from the waterless pit.

The New Testament Lesson: Luke 19:28-44

²⁸After Jesus had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. ²⁹As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, ³⁰ "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³¹ If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Lord needs it.'"

³²Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them. ³³As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" ³⁴They replied, "The Lord needs it."

³⁵They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. ³⁶As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road.

³⁷When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen:

³⁸ "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

³⁹ Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"

⁴⁰ "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out."

⁴¹As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it ⁴² and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes. ⁴³The days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment against you and encircle you and hem you in on every side. ⁴⁴They will dash you to the ground, you and the children within your walls. They will not leave one stone on another, because you did not recognize the time of God's coming to you."

PALM SUNDAY 2022

THE WEEPING KING

Luke 19:28-44

To receive Jesus is to receive God. To reject Jesus is to reject God.

Worship the KING who alone is in complete control. (28-34)

It is dangerous to sacrifice to Jesus without surrendering to him.

Worship the KING who alone embodies perfect humility. (35-36)

It is dangerous to respect Jesus publicly without receiving him personally.

Worship the KING who alone can save you for all eternity. (37-38)

It is dangerous to call Jesus your king while denying him the throne of your heart.

Worship the KING who alone is Lord of the universe. (39-40)

It is dangerous to view Jesus as a good moral teacher but not as the Son of God.

Worship the KING who alone will grieve over your soul. (41-42)

It is dangerous to think Jesus is always affirming but never challenging toward his people.

Worship the KING who alone is the righteous judge. (43-44)

It is dangerous to see Jesus as a great spiritual leader without recognizing his deity.
