# Call to Worship: Psalm 68:4, 19 (Responsive)

<sup>4</sup> Sing to God, sing in praise of his name, extol him who rides on the clouds;

rejoice before him—his name is the LORD. <sup>19</sup> Praise be to the Lord, to God our Savior, who daily bears our burdens.



### The Old Testament Lesson: 2 Kings 2:9-15

<sup>9</sup>When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "Tell me, what can I do for you before I am taken from you?"

"Let me inherit a double portion of your spirit," Elisha replied.

<sup>10</sup> "You have asked a difficult thing," Elijah said, "yet if you see me when I am taken from you, it will be yours—otherwise, it will not."

<sup>11</sup>As they were walking along and talking together, suddenly a chariot of fire and horses of fire appeared and separated the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind. <sup>12</sup>Elisha saw this and cried out, "My father! My father! The chariots and horsemen of Israel!" And Elisha saw him no more. Then he took hold of his garment and tore it in two.

<sup>13</sup> Elisha then picked up Elijah's cloak that had fallen from him and went back and stood on the bank of the Jordan. <sup>14</sup> He took the cloak that had fallen from Elijah and struck the water with it. "Where now is the LORD, the God of Elijah?" he asked. When he struck the water, it divided to the right and to the left, and he crossed over.

<sup>15</sup>The company of the prophets from Jericho, who were watching, said, "The spirit of Elijah is resting on Elisha."And they went to meet him and bowed to the ground before him.

### The Response: Psalm 16:1-11 (Responsive)

<sup>1</sup> Keep me safe, my God, for in you I take refuge.

#### <sup>2</sup> I say to the LORD, "You are my Lord; apart from you I have no good thing."

<sup>3</sup>I say of the holy people who are in the land,

"They are the noble ones in whom is all my delight."

<sup>4</sup>Those who run after other gods will suffer more and more.

I will not pour out libations of blood to such gods or take up their names on my lips.

#### <sup>5</sup> LORD, you alone are my portion and my cup; you make my lot secure.

<sup>6</sup>The boundary lines have fallen for me in pleasant places; surely I have a delightful inheritance.

#### <sup>7</sup> I will praise the LORD, who counsels me; even at night my heart instructs me.

<sup>8</sup>I keep my eyes always on the LORD.

With him at my right hand, I will not be shaken.

# <sup>9</sup>Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices;

my body also will rest secure,

<sup>10</sup> because you will not abandon me to the realm of the dead, nor will you let your faithful one see decay.

<sup>11</sup>You make known to me the path of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand.

## The New Testament Lesson: Philemon 1-16

<sup>1</sup>Paul, a prisoner of Christ Jesus, and Timothy our brother,

To Philemon our dear friend and fellow worker—<sup>2</sup> also to Apphia our sister and Archippus our fellow soldier—and to the church that meets in your home:

<sup>3</sup>Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

<sup>4</sup>I always thank my God as I remember you in my prayers, <sup>5</sup> because I hear about your love for all his holy people and your faith in the Lord Jesus. <sup>6</sup>I pray that your partnership with us in the faith may be effective in deepening your understanding of every good thing we share for the sake of Christ. <sup>7</sup>Your love has given me great joy and encouragement, because you, brother, have refreshed the hearts of the Lord's people.

<sup>8</sup>Therefore, although in Christ I could be bold and order you to do what you ought to do, <sup>9</sup> yet I prefer to appeal to you on the basis of love. It is as none other than Paul—an old man and now also a prisoner of Christ Jesus—<sup>10</sup> that I appeal to you for my son Onesimus, who became my son while I was in chains. <sup>11</sup> Formerly he was useless to you, but now he has become useful both to you and to me.

<sup>12</sup> I am sending him—who is my very heart back to you. <sup>13</sup> I would have liked to keep him with me so that he could take your place in helping me while I am in chains for the gospel. <sup>14</sup> But I did not want to do anything without your consent, so that any favor you do would not seem forced but would be voluntary. <sup>15</sup> Perhaps the reason he was separated from you for a little while was that you might have him back forever—<sup>16</sup> no longer as a slave, but better than a slave, as a dear brother. He is very dear to me but even dearer to you, both as a fellow man and as a brother in the Lord.
