The Old Testament Lesson: **Hosea 11:1-11**

- ¹ "When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son.
- ²But the more they were called, the more they went away from me.
- They sacrificed to the Baals and they burned incense to images.
- ³ It was I who taught Ephraim to walk, taking them by the arms;
- but they did not realize it was I who healed them.
- ⁴I led them with cords of human kindness, with ties of love.
- To them I was like one who lifts a little child to the cheek, and I bent down to feed them.
- ⁵ "Will they not return to Egypt and will not Assyria rule over them because they refuse to repent?
- ⁶A sword will flash in their cities; it will devour their false prophets and put an end to their plans.
- ⁷ My people are determined to turn from me. Even though they call me God Most High, I will by no means exalt them.
- ⁸"How can I give you up, Ephraim? How can I hand you over, Israel?
- How can I treat you like Admah? How can I make you like Zeboyim?
- My heart is changed within me; all my compassion is aroused.
- ⁹I will not carry out my fierce anger, nor will I devastate Ephraim again.

For I am God, and not a man the Holy One among you. I will not come against their cities.

¹⁰They will follow the LORD; he will roar like a lion.

When he roars.

his children will come trembling from the west.

¹¹They will come from Egypt, trembling like sparrows, from Assyria, fluttering like doves.

I will settle them in their homes," declares the LORD.

The Response: **Psalm 49:1-11** (Responsive)

- ¹Hear this, all you peoples; listen, all who live in this world,
- ²both low and high, rich and poor alike:
- ³ My mouth will speak words of wisdom; the meditation of my heart will give you understanding.
- ⁴I will turn my ear to a proverb; with the harp I will expound my riddle:
- ⁵Why should I fear when evil days come, when wicked deceivers surround me—
- ⁶ those who trust in their wealth and boast of their great riches?
- ⁷ No one can redeem the life of another or give to God a ransom for them—
- 8 the ransom for a life is costly, no payment is ever enough—
- ⁹ so that they should live on forever and not see decay.
- ¹⁰ For all can see that the wise die, that the foolish and the senseless also perish, leaving their wealth to others.
- ¹¹Their tombs will remain their houses forever, their dwellings for endless generations, though they had named lands after themselves.

The New Testament Lesson: Luke 12:13-21

¹³ Someone in the crowd said to him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me."

¹⁴ Jesus replied, "Man, who appointed me a judge or an arbiter between you?" ¹⁵ Then he said to them, "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions."

¹⁶And he told them this parable: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded an abundant harvest. ¹⁷He thought to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.'

¹⁸ "Then he said, 'This is what I'll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store my surplus grain. ¹⁹ And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of grain laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry."

²⁰ "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?'

²¹ "This is how it will be with whoever stores up things for themselves but is not rich toward God."

and wait for thee, sweet hour of prayer.


