A = No adultery




F = No false witness


C = No coveting











The Language of the First Commandment


Second person singular ("you" singular)


No other gods "before"/"against" my face

It's one thing to get Israel out of Egypt; it's another thing to get Egypt out of Israel.










The Violation of the First Commandment

God wants (and deserves) to have primacy or preeminence in his people's lives.


God finds it revolting to have "competition" from substitutes.


The Revelation of the First Commandment

Question: Is God not humble? Is he a narcissistic God?






The Revelation of the First Commandment
