PRIVATE TOUR OF THE CHESTNUT STREET COMMUNITY CENTER

Friends of Christ Community Church are invited to a private tour of the Chestnut Street Community Center in Lebanon this **Sunday, January 28 at 2:00 p.m.** (after the special congregational meeting). We will meet Dave and Laurie Funk in the sanctuary at 6th & Chestnut Street, where the tour will begin.

The Funks founded the Chestnut Street Community Center in 2021 with a vision for revitalizing what used to be the **First Lebanon EC Church facility**. With two congregations now in residence (Ministerio Vida Nueva en Cristo and Iglesia el Buen Pastor), and developing partnerships with the Lebanon County Christian Ministries Fresh Start Emergency Shelter, IU13 Community Education, Penn State Reach, and Cornwall Manor Trailside Farm, they are well on their way!

Their expansion of practical ministries to the community is a **direct answer to the prayers** of First Lebanon Church members who merged with the Zion Myerstown Church in 2021 to form Christ Community Church. Check out the website of this CCC-supported ministry here.
