

had been around Jesus' head. The cloth was folded up by itself, separate from the linen. ⁸ Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. ⁹ (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.)

Every time Jesus meets people after the resurrection, he helps them to believe in him.





The risen Christ deals with each person uniquely —according to his or her needs and personality.


Running through the Cemetery

▶ Jesus gives people time and space to wrestle with—and then plenty of reasons to rest in his resurrection from the dead.














